For Parents: How to have family devotions

Step 1—Set aside time each day when the whole family is normally together. That time may be at the breakfast or dinner table. Whatever time works for your family, make it a regular event each day.

Step 2—Include at least these three elements: reading God's Word, discussion and teaching, and prayer. The Bible is God's Word and the primary way in which God speaks to us. Reading the Bible is most important to understanding God's plan for us, salvation, and how we should live. We cannot know God without reading His word! You can read a portion of Scripture with your family, or you can follow a Bible reading plan, or you can use a family devotion book or daily devotion guide.

It is important to guide the family

to understand what you have read. Ask simple, age-appropriate questions that will help guide the family to understand the Scripture. Let them answer, then you can correct any error and teach what is true. Finally, prayer is how we connect with God. Start by allowing each person to give thanks to God and to praise Him for the many good things He has done for you. It is important to include confession for our sins into this time of prayer. Also it is good to pray for other people who you know are in need, this is called intercession. And of course, pray for your own needs.

That's it! You can add other things like singing or acting out the Bible story, if you choose. The most important thing is to do it regularly. You will be blessed!
